be many Aboriginal artisans offering a wide variety of handcrafted wares - everything

from beading, leatherwork, moccasins, and jewellery. A food area offering a wide

selection of traditional Aboriginal foods will operate throughout the event.

The Pow Wow will be held at the Ottawa Municipal Campground, 411 Corkstown Road,

Nepean, which is located off Moodie Drive North in Nepean (north of Highway 417).
