Applications are now being accepted for the Urban Aboriginal Alternate High School Program

Eligibility:

1. Be a resident of Ontario.
2. Identify as being of Native ancestry, (status, non-status, Metis, Inuit).
3. Be between 16 and 19 years of age.
4. Have experienced at least one year of high school.
5. Have an adult who is willing to act as a mentor.

Students who are interested and eligible should pick up an Application Package from the Odawa Native Friendship Centre. Applicants who have completed the package and returned the **General Information Page** to the Centre, will be considered for an interview. Interviews for September admission will be held at the Centre in September 2007.

Note:

- *The student is strongly encouraged to find an adult who is willing to act as their **mentor** or advocate. This person can be a parent, relative, (older) sibling, neighbour, and friend- anyone who knows the student and is willing to support their admission and participation in the program. If the student is unable to find someone, they need to notify the staff, before they are scheduled for the interview so that alternate arrangements can be made.*
- *Students who do not have copies of transcripts or recent academic reports will be asked to leave the name and phone number of their former school with a program staff member.*
